PLOTHOLDER AGREEMENT

Farm Season

The farm is open from May to October each year. Gardeners are permitted on site from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm daily during the season.

Plot Assignment

Plots are assigned at the discretion of the Acadia Farm. Returning plot holders may request the same plot as the previous season and we will attempt to accommodate these requests. Plot holders may request a single, half or double plot. Doubles are only available as space permits.

Expiry

In order to ensure that farm land is used to its full potential, there is a 3 week expiry date for all plots. This means that if your plot is not tended within 3 weeks of the first planting day (by May 29th) it may be forfeited and assigned to a individual on the waiting list). If there are extenuating circumstances preventing you from tending your plot, please let us know.

Volunteer Work Exchange

In addition to providing land, tools, and water for anyone interested in planting their own garden, the ACF, with the help of its community gardeners, also grows food to donate to the Wolfville Area food bank and to sell to Acadia Dining Hall. We do not charge for plots so that the garden is accessible for all. Instead we ask for a volunteer commitment in exchange for your plot. During the season plot holders are asked to volunteer for 6 hours at your convenience to assist with the university and food bank plots. This way we also get to know each other better, share in the satisfaction of seeing our communal garden grow and give back to the community.
